On two separate occasions in Upper Room meeting, on a Monday, I must have been particularly apprehensive. Our leader Bev Avers organized a laying of hands for me with sisters surrounding me with their hand on my shoulder and her hand on my head. Those times I felt the Holy Spirit enter my body. All further surgeries were successful.

Since then I have felt God's calling me to be of service to others. In addition to Bible studies I am now involved in a cancer support group as a support person not a cancer survivor. I also help a wonderful lady from Bangladesh in her quest to learn English.
